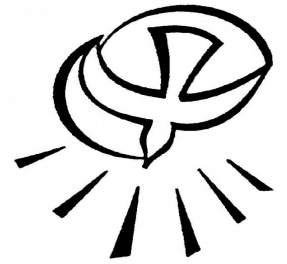

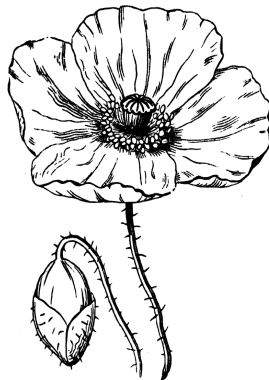
Monday 30th October – 1- 3pm. Craft and Chat.
