

The Penny Gospel...

You may have received, or are about to receive, a copy of "The Penny Gospel" through your door, or you may have delivered some (as a church we have delivered our full quota of about 850), or have seen them piled at the back of the church. What's it all about?????

To coincide with the Common-wealth games, the Scottish Bible Society have produced the penny gospel (penny, because that is how much each one will cost a church), with the vision that they will be delivered to every home in Scotland.



The ACTS group in Kirkintilloch/Lenzie have whole-heartedly embraced the vision, and are aiming, before the Commonwealth Games, to get one delivered to all the houses in the area. Each church has agreed to deliver somewhere around a thousand gospels.

Each book contains the whole of Luke's Gospel, plus testimonies of Christian athletes – appropriate to the Commonwealth Games. It is a great opportunity for the church to mark a very special occasion for Scotland, as well as extend the story of Jesus Christ.

Many thanks to everyone who helped deliver our share, and hope you enjoy reading yours when it arrives.

On Wednesday Evenings during July and August we will be having time to look at well known bible stories, to find out more about what they have to say to us.
