Next Sunday – 9th November – is Remembrance Sunday.

We will particularly be marking this in our main service at 10.30am, which will include the two minutes silence, as well as remembering those from St. Cyprian's who were killed in the two great wars.

St. Cyprian's is also organising the Remembrance Service on the Woodilee Estate. This service is at 2.00pm, at the Woodilee memorial. Everyone is welcome, and if you want to know where the memorial is, please ask the Rector.

As you will know, our church organ has stopped working. We are attempting to get the organ repaired, with no success to date. It is clear to us that we need to replace the organ. Even if we do get it repaired, it is over 20 years old, and is likely to stop again in the not too distant future and will need to be replaced.

The vestry is on the case! A small group has been appointed to consider what organs are available on the market, to try them out, and to make a recommendation to the vestry what we should consider purchasing. That group consists of the Rector, Mary Boyd, Paul Hindle, Jill Taylor and Jacqui Stother.

The vestry does not want to rush into a decision – we want to ensure we get the right organ for our church – once we have the organ we will have it for a long time. It could take a few months before we have decided which is the right machine. It is envisaged that replacing the current organ will cost about £20,000.

Organs do not come cheap, and we will need to raise some money to cover the cost – that is to come in the near future, although we are willing to take donations now!!!!
