This year's Bishop's Appeal is for MACS – Malawi Association fort Christian Support, a charity set up in 1993, which supports projects in Malawi. During 2017/18 the charity gave support of about £175,000 to 23 projects, ranging from housing a health care assistant, to roofing a church, to supporting 72 secondary school pupils with bursaries.

At present it is attempting to raise about £175,000 to build a new operating block at St. Luke's hospital, Malosa, Malawi, replacing a single operating theatre built in 1965. They have currently raised over £107,000 towards this project.
