Our Mother’s Union meets on Wednesday 11th May at 7.30pm. They plan to do some work in the garden, particularly on the Mother’s Union garden by the main entrance of the church. Why not come along – everyone welcome.

In previous years (BL – Before Lockdown!) we gave everyone the chance to choose the hymns for a Sunday through the summer, and I think this would be good to do now we are moving into our future. If you would like to choose hymns, then please write down the five hymns you would like. As a general rule, we have a “lively” one at the beginning and end. We have a thoughtful one as the Communion Hymn. We then have two other hymns – one “amongst” the readings, the other at the offertory. Choose your hymns. Pass them on to the Rector before mid May.

We have re-introduced the cup for communion. I know for many people this might seem risky. So I want to say: Firstly – you do not have to receive the wine. If you just choose to receive the bread only, that is still 100% Communion! Secondly, if you choose not to receive the wine, still come to that rail to receive the bread, then simply return to your seat before the person with the wine gets to you. Thirdly – the person administering the wine will follow all Covid protocols – cleaning of hands, wearing a mask.
