Joint Advent Study group with St James the less, Bishopbriggs

Wednesdays 22nd and 29th November and 6th and 13th December at 7pm

We're planning to base the study on the book, *The Meaning is in the Waiting: The Sprit of Advent* by Paula Gooder. It looks in turn at the waiting of Abraham and Sarah, the Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary. It is just 125 pages long and is very accessible to read.

Here are some words from the back cover: A series of reflections inspired by the Bible considers why we need to wait, what it feels like to be someone who waits, what happens when we lose patience or hope, and why God may want us to get better at waiting.

The book is £9.99 on Amazon for a new paper copy or £7.99 for a kindle version (cheaper second hand paperbacks may be available). Paul (Hindle) can get the paperbacks quickly with Amazon Prime if you wish.

Paul Watson says, "I think it will be a great way of journeying through Advent and placing our own experience within the broader Christmas story".
